

# Feed the Puppet

This game is to help your child learn that if they use the wrong sounds the words will mean something different.

Cut up the pictures attached and check that your child knows what each picture is before you start.

To play this game you will need a hand puppet or an old sock.

Place the pictures face up on the table or floor and ask your child for one to feed to the puppet. Encourage your child to listen carefully. If they feed the puppet the wrong picture, 'spit' it out and ask again.

Next let your child have the puppet so they can ask you for the pictures. Remember you must give the puppet the picture your child says and not the one you think they mean.



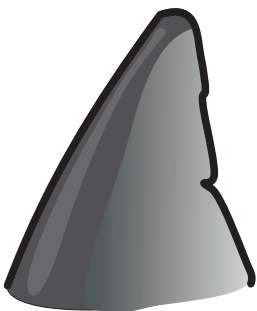
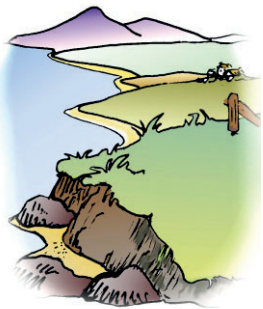
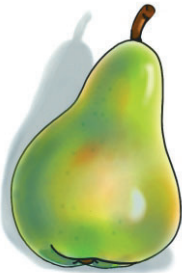
## Variations
